



# Trends and Characteristics of Delinquency Cases Handled in Juvenile Court, 2019

### Delinquency caseloads in 2019 for property, drug, and public order offenses were at their lowest level since 2005




## Compared with 2005, the 2019 delinquency caseload included a smaller proportion of white youth




Note: Other race includes American Indian/Alaskan Natives and Asian/Pacific Islanders.


## The likelihood of detention increased for property cases between 2005 and 2019 but declined for drug cases
