Mentor Characteristics

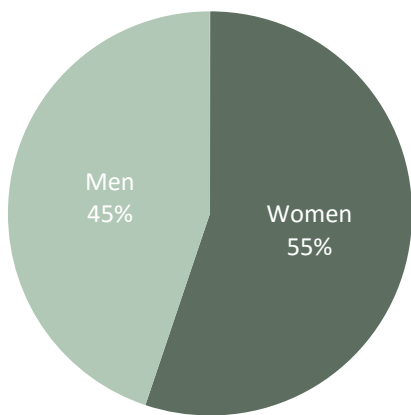
Mentors completed screening and baseline surveys, in which they reported on their demographics and previous experiences.

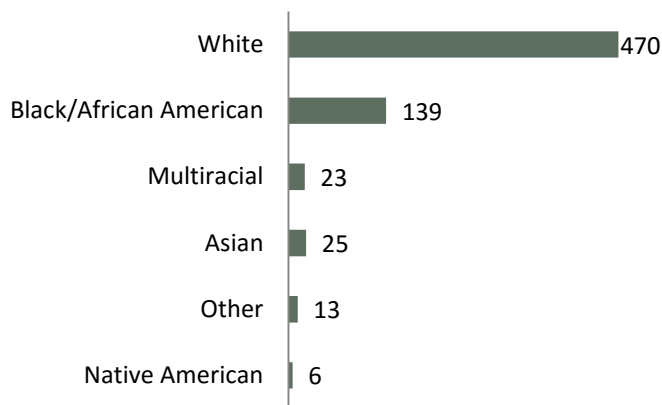

Mentor Demographics

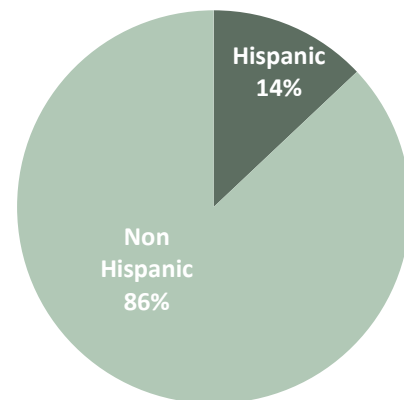
Gender



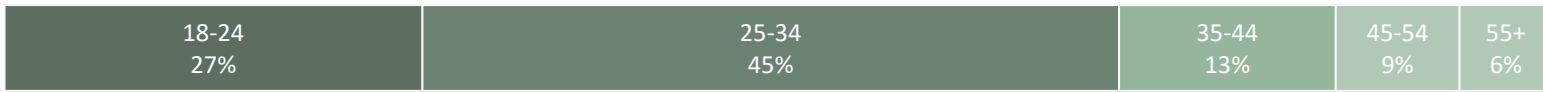
Race



Ethnicity

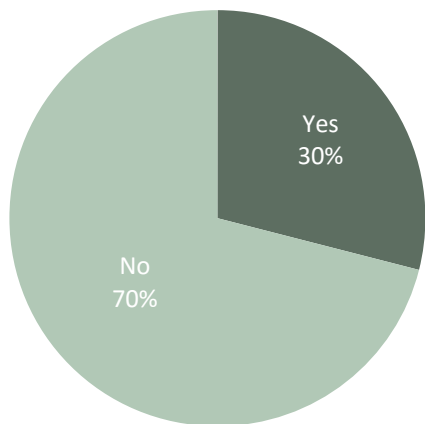


Age (in years)



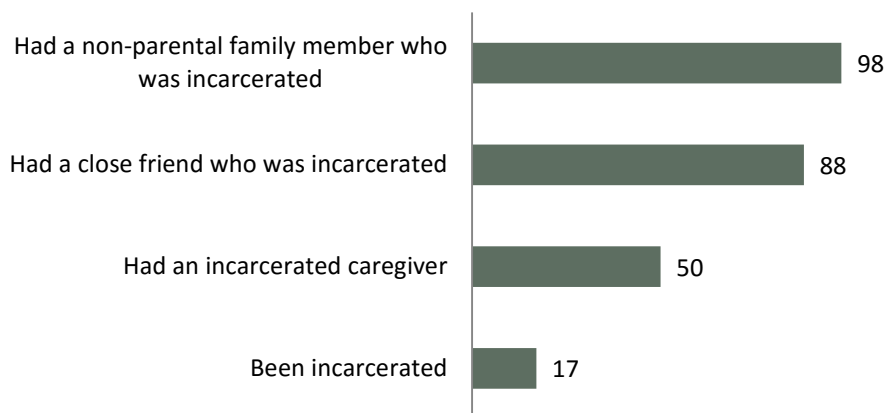
Previously Served as a Mentor
